Reception



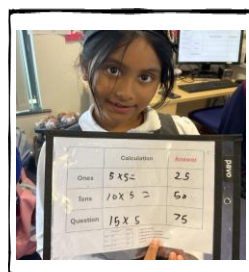

Years 1 /2 & 2



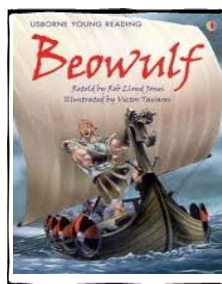

Year 4



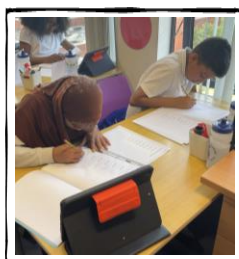
