What's been happening this week?

Nursery



This week in nursery we have been reading the book 'We All Went On Safari'. In maths we made African jewellery using cheerios and pasta shells, to make a repeating pattern. In writing we made postcards from safari, drawing our favourite safari animal and trying to form the letters we could recognise in the animal's name.

Reception



This week has been an exciting one for reception as we have watched our chicks grow. We have been learning lots of facts about chicks and used our phonic knowledge to write about them. We even gave them all names! In maths we have been learning halving and sharing. We each made a cupcake by sharing out the ingredients.

Year 1



In English, Year 1 have been looking at our new text, 'The Queen's Hat' and sequencing the story with time adverbials. In maths, we have been subtracting using part-whole models and number-lines. Sapphire Class have been busy with lots of phonics practice to help with our reading. In science, we looked at different parts of plants, with our artistic skills we have drawn and labelled plants.

Years 1 /2 & 2



This week year 2 have been learning about plants. We have used our existing knowledge and identified some common plants, and we have all had a go at planting our own Sunflowers. We have identified what they need to grow including light, water and the correct temperature. Now we keep our fingers crossed

Year 3



This week, Year 3 have been completing their alternative retells of Egyptian Cinderella. Why don't you ask us how we changed the story? In Maths we have been expert learners when using column subtraction to regroup through zero. We have also been exploring parts of the human skeleton.
