Year 3



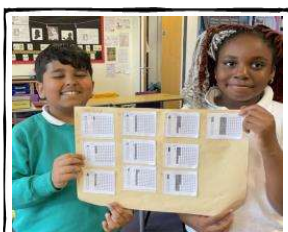
