What's been happening this week?



Nursery



This week Nursery have started a new topic on 'Minibeasts'. The children have enjoyed reading the book 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar'. They have been enjoying creating caterpillars in the workshop area using a variety of resources. The children have been acting out the story through yoga, this has been very relaxing,

Reception



This week in Maths Ruby class have been consolidating their number bonds to 10. In English we have begun our new topic animals and their habitats and our story is 'Lost and found' ask your child what our story is about. We have also decorated some special biscuits for Eid Mubarak.

Year 1



This week in maths, we have looked at odd and even numbers. We compared numbers up to 100! For curriculum week, we looked at the British Value 'Mutual Respect'. From our key text, 'Two Monsters' we discussed how important it is to respect each other. We created a jigsaw to show how we are different, but we fit together.

Years 1 /2 & 2



This week in English Year 2 have been learning about all the jobs that make up life inside a medieval castle for an information text. For Curriculum Week we looked at the British Value of Mutual Respect. Using the book 'Two Monsters' by David McKee we created speech bubbles, Monster posters and wrote diary entries about what it means to show Mutual Respect.

Year 3



During curriculum week, Year 3 have explored Democracy. We began learning about what Democracy is and what it means to be British. The children took part in secret ballots, explored women's rights to vote and petitioned for a change in after school clubs next year!

Year 4



Year 4 have been writing poems based on the inventions created by the Romans using figurative language. In Maths we have been rounding numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000. The highlight of the week has been learning about the 'Rule of Law'. We have researched the 'Magna Carta' and people who fought for justice. Ask us what we have learnt so far.

Year 5



Year 5 have been looking at British Values in Curriculum week. We focussed on 'Tolerance'. We read 'The Smeds and The Smoos' in English and had a discussion what it means to be tolerant of others and why it is important to have tolerance.

Year 6



During Curriculum Week, Year 6 explored the theme of *Individual Liberty*. We began by learning about what it means to be British, examining our shared values and cultural identity. We then looked at key historical events that have shaped the rights and freedoms we enjoy today. A major focus was on *human rights* — we discussed their importance and reflected on the rights that mattered most to each of us.
